February 1-4 - France's submission to the Oscars is set in the Saint-Omer court of law. Young novelist Rama attends the trial of a young woman accused of killing her 15-month-old daughter by abandoning her to the rising tide on a beach in northern France. MOONLIGHT

February 1 - In partnership with Out Boulder County during Black History Month, this highlights the intersection of the black and queer experience. The Oscar Best Picture for 2017 is a look at three defining chapters in the life of Chiron, a young black man growing up in Miami. NATIONAL THEATER LIVE: STRAIGHT LINE CRAZY

February 5 & 7 - Ralph Fiennes leads the cast in David Hare's blazing account of the most powerful man in New York, a master manipulator whose legacy changed the city forever. For forty uninterrupted years, Robert Moses exploited those in office through a mix of charm and intimidation, creating parks, bridges and 627 miles of expressway. Faced with resistance by protest groups campaigning for a very different idea of what the city should become, will the weakness of democracy be exposed in

the face of his charismatic conviction? (running time, approx 3:00)

A FAMILY FOR 1640 DAYS

February 8-11 - The heartfelt, heartbreaking story of transition in one family's life as foster parents are told they must gradually, definitively, hand 6-year-old Simon — the foster child they've raised since he was 18 months old — over to his "real" father. **CLASSICS WITH JEFFREY KASH:
MURDER ON THE ORIENT EXPRESS**

February 13 - This is the 1974 version of the Agatha Christie mystery, with Albert Finney in the role of Hercule Poirot. It won an Oscar for Ingrid Bergman, as well as being nominated in five other categories. The star-studded cast of this ensemble piece is truly amazing, including Lauren Bacall, Sean Connery, John Gielgud, Jean-Pierre Cassel, Vanessa Redgrave, Michael York, Rachel Roberts, Jacqueline Bisset, Richard Widmark, and Anthony Perkins. PARIAH

February 15 - In partnership with Out Boulder County during Black History Month, we're showing this deeply authentic film about growing up African-American and queer. Teenage Alike lives in Brooklyn's Fort Greene neighborhood with her parents and younger sister A lesbian, Alike quietly embraces her identity and is looking for her first lover, but she wonders how much she can truly confide in her family, especially with her parents' marriage already strained. CHESS STORY

February 16-19 - Vienna, 1938: Austria is occupied by the Nazis. To withstand the psychological torture of the Gestapo, a lawyer imprisoned by the Nazis finds refuge in the world of chess. With opulent attention to period detail, this adaptation brings Stefan Zweig's stirring final novella to life. (Philipp Stölzl, 2021, Germany, 1:50, NR)

LOWNDES COUNTY AND THE ROAD TO BLACK POWER

February 16-19 - In the mid-1960s, Lowndes County, Alabama had zero registered Black voters despite an 80% Black population. Through first person accounts and searing archival footage, this documentary chronicles the citizens' movement and young Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee organizers led by Stokely Carmichael who risked their lives for Black voting rights. (Geeta Gandbhir & Sam Pollard, 2022, USA, 1:30, NR)

GEOGRAPHIES OF SOLITUDE

February 22-26 - An immersion into the rich ecosystem of Sable Island, a remote sliver of land in the N.W. Atlantic, this documentary follows Zoe Lucas, a naturalist and environmentalist who has lived there for over 40 years collecting, cleaning and documenting marine litter that persistently washes up on the island's shores. THE CIVIL DEAD | February 10 - A misanthropic, struggling photographer just wants to watch TV and eat candy while his wife is out of town, but when a desperate old pal resurfaces, his plans are thwarted, with spooky consequences. (Clay Tatum, 2022, USA, 1:44, NR)

INFINITY POOL | February 17 - James and Em Foster are enjoying an all-inclusive beach vacation in the fictional island of La Tolqa, when a fatal accident exposes the resort's perverse subculture of hedonistic tourism, reckless violence and surreal horrors. AMIGO | February 24 - After a violent accident a man decides to accommodate and care for his disabled best friend. But as the two of them begin arguing, the truth about their toxic, homicidal relationship bubbles to the surface, and madness soon takes hold.
